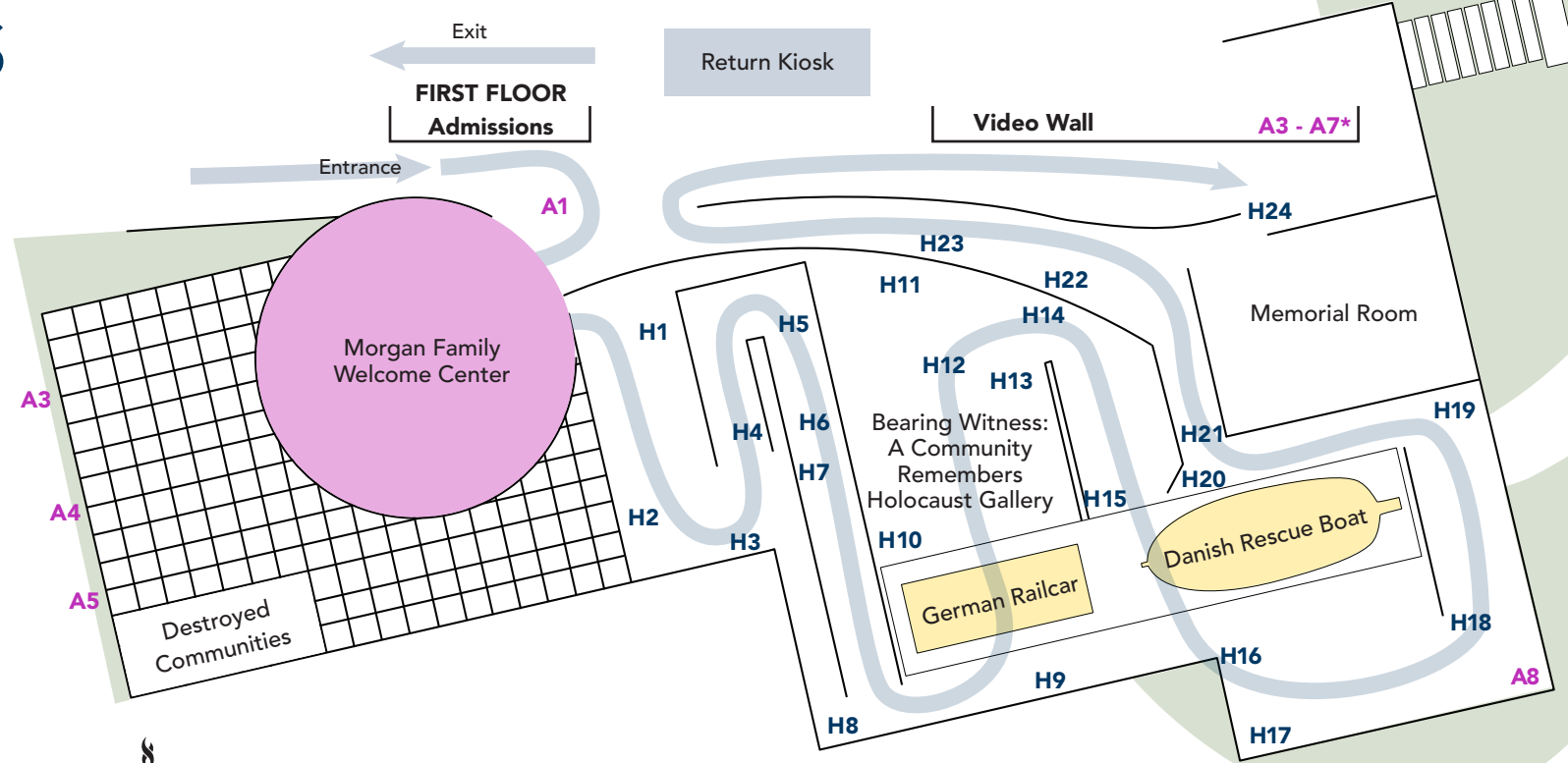


Tours are color-coded on the map and by stickers on trigger stops.

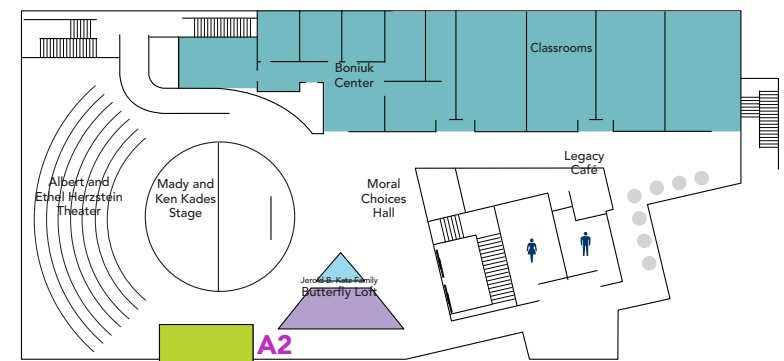
A7 This stop is located on the large concrete vault at the corner of Binz St. and Caroline St., inside the parking lot.

**Outdoor architectural stops are also available here if you are unable to access the outdoor locations.*

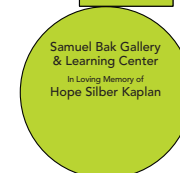
ARCHITECTURAL TOUR

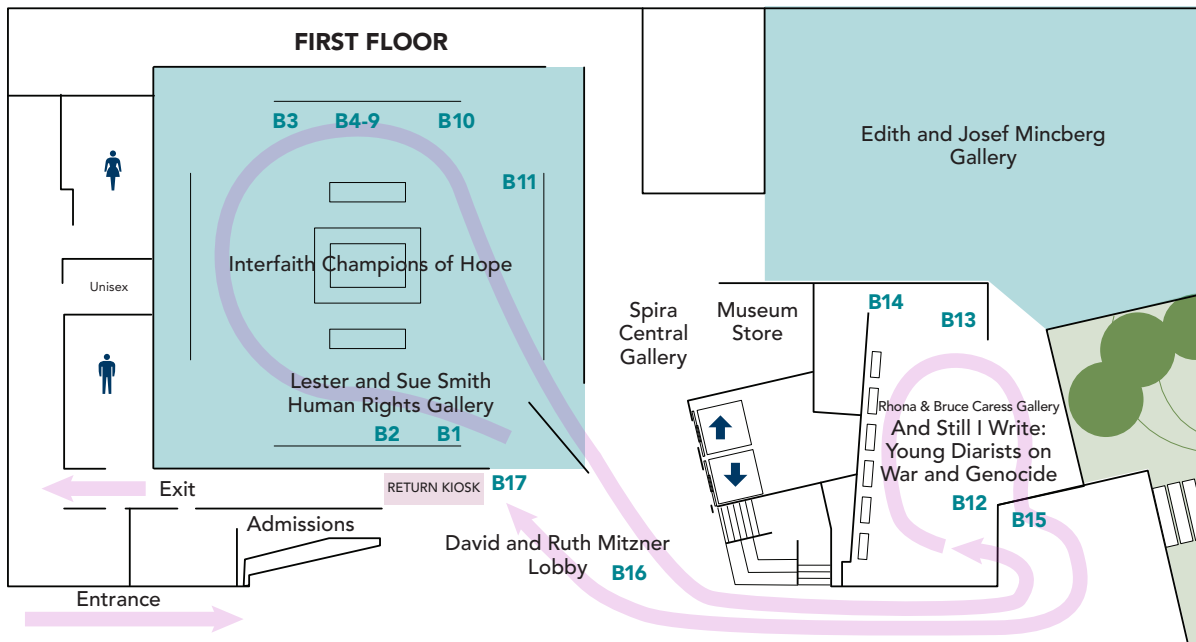
