Holocaust Museum Houston calls on our community to stand up for the freedom to read during Banned Books Week. This annual event, held October 1 - 7, 2023, brings together the entire book community - librarians, booksellers, publishers, journalists, teachers, and readers of all types - in shared support of the freedom to seek and express ideas, even those some may consider unorthodox, offensive, or unpopular.

Banned Books Week continues to be relevant. Recently, a Texas teacher was fired for reading from an illustrated version of Anne Frank's diary. According to the American Library Association, Texas saw the most attempts to restrict books last year of any state. Part of a broader national trend targeting the right of students to read about historical truth, racism, the LGBTQ community, and more.
