CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF HOPE

Holocaust Museum Houston, Morgan Family Center opened its doors in 1996 with the goal of honoring the survivors' legacy and teaching the dangers of hatred, prejudice and apathy. In 2019, after a two-year expansion, the Museum more than doubled in size to become the nation's fourth-largest Holocaust museum and the first to be fully bilingual in English and Spanish. The Museum has served more than 6.5 million students, welcomed more than 2.8 million visitors and trained more than 40,000 educators. The new Lester and Sue Smith Campus is uniquely positioned to be the voice of the Museum's nearly 1,000 survivors as a superregional hub for Holocaust education and a national ambassador for human rights and social justice.

Bearing Witness: A Community Remembers
Authentic film footage, artifacts, photographs, and documents show life in pre-war Europe, the Nazi move toward the "Final Solution," and life after the Holocaust.
- Besa: Muslims Who Saved Jews During the Holocaust**
Albania, a European country with a Muslim majority, succeeded where other European nations failed in dealing with Nazi Germany. Almost all Jews living within Albanian borders during the German occupation – those of Albanian origin and refugees alike – were saved. In a five-year project, Colorado-based photographer Norman Gershman set out to collect the names of righteous, non-Jews who saved Jews during the Holocaust. He discovered that some of the names were of Albanian Muslims. He then began a quest to meet and photograph the Albanian rescuers or their descendants. During his interviews, when he asked why they had rescued Jews, the resounding response was "Besa" the code of honor deeply rooted in Albanian culture and incorporated in the faith of Albanian Muslims. As Gershman later would explain, "There was no government conspiracy or underground
