HOPE: Stories of Houston Survivors opens at Holocaust Museum Houston September 22, 2023

--Annual exhibition offers video introductions to local Holocaust Survivors and their families--

HOUSTON (September 20, 2023) – Learn about the extraordinary lives of seven local Holocaust Survivors and their legacy with the upcoming fourth installment of *HOPE: Stories of Houston Survivors*. The annual exhibition is on view September 22 through December 3, 2023, in Holocaust Museum Houston's (HMH) Spira Central Gallery.

Curated by Holocaust Museum Houston's Carol Manley, *HOPE: Stories of Houston Survivors* offers a compelling video introduction of Houston Holocaust Survivors featuring family members' memories, including an interview with a fourth generation Survivor. Family artifacts, including passports, photographs and more will be showcased throughout the exhibition.

This installment of the exhibition will include local Holocaust Survivors Wolf Finkelman, Al Marks, Ruth Schnitzer, Otto Schlamme, Lissa Streusand, Ben Waserman and Zoly Zamir. Their testimonies tell stories of German occupation, the November Pogroms, life in concentration camps, immigration and starting anew in Houston.
