The Holocaust did not begin with concentration camps and the killing of the Jewish people. It began with words and propaganda. We call on everyone to denounce antisemitism and all forms of hate speech.

In the words of Holocaust Survivor Elie Wiesel, "There may be times when we are powerless to prevent injustice, but there must never be a time when we fail to protest."
