

Guidelines for Social Media Contributions

We welcome your feedback and your contributions to our social media profiles about issues that are consistent with the Museum's mission to educate people about the Holocaust, remember the 6 million Jews and other innocent victims, honor the Survivors' legacy, and teach the dangers of hatred, prejudice and apathy using the lessons of the Holocaust and other genocides.

The Museum strives to encourage a forum that is open and welcoming to many viewpoints and opinions. Towards that goal, we reserve the right to remove posts and comments that violate the following guidelines:

- 1. Stay on topic—all contributions to our pages should be relevant to its stated purpose (see above).
- 2. Provide appropriate explanatory context for posted links, photos, and videos.
- 3. Be courteous. Do not use vulgarity, disparaging, threatening, or antisemitic language that might abuse or target others.
- 4. We appreciate, and will address, honest questions about the complexity of Holocaust history, but posts that disseminate misleading information, such as Holocaust distortion and denial, conspiracy theories, careless Holocaust analogies or historically inaccurate information may be deleted.
- 5. Challenge ideas and opinions, but refrain from attacks against groups or individuals.
- 6. Do not solicit or market products.
- 7. Repeated posts to our page may be treated as SPAM and deleted; repeat offenders may be banned.
