## Holocaust Museum Houston Will Host Dr. Ibram X. Kendi for Free Virtual Lecture

**Houston (May 2, 2021)** . . . Holocaust Museum Houston (HMH) will host author Dr. Ibram X. Kendi for a free virtual lecture on Wednesday, May 19 at 7:00 p.m. Central Time. In recognizing the significance of antiracist programming, HMH has invited Dr. Ibram X. Kendi, one of America's foremost historians and leading antiracist scholars, to speak about his 2019 book, *How to Be an Antiracist*. Dr. Kendi's presentation will be centered on defining what it means to be antiracist and what actions people can take to clearly see all forms of racism.

"Dr. Kendi asks us to think about what an antiracist society might look like, and how we can play an active role in building it," said HMH CEO Dr. Kelly J. Zúñiga. "Similarly, at the Museum, we envision a society that transforms ignorance into respect for human life, and we reaffirm an individual's responsibility for the collective actions of society. We're honored to be a venue for Houston and beyond to hear this exciting scholar."

Kendi is a #1 New York Times bestselling and National Book Award-winning author, professor, antiracist activist and historian of race and discriminatory policy in America. In July 2020, he assumed the position of founding director of the Center for Antiracist Research at Boston University. Kendi was included in Time Magazine's 100 Most Influential People of 2020.
